ALUMNI HALL GETS A MAKEOVER

Our Lady of Perpetual Help School's "cafeteria" serves the community in a variety of ways. It serves as a lunchroom, a meeting hall, a classroom, and a central place where students, family members and parishoners gather. Under the guidance of Mr. William Kovacich and Mr. Edward Mahoney ('61), graduation class composite photos were framed and hung along the walls. The cafeteria was officially named "Alumni Hall". To date, 83 class composites hang in Alumni Hall. However, due to recent problems with the lower level flooring, especially in the hall, replacing the floor became a priority for Ms. Franco and Father Villote. Funds for this project were generated from parents, alumni, previous auction events, grants and parishioners. The makeover included replacing and retiling the floor, repainting the



walls, refinishing the stage, and mounting a new OLPH welcome sign. The project, which took the entire summer, cost \$89,000. We believe this large investment, to such a central and important space, not only displays our past in a special way, but also, allows us a promise for a successful and beautiful future. We look forward to showing it off to you at the Alumni Auction.

Inspired by this year's school theme, the 8th grade parents, alongside their teacher, Mr. Marquez, contributed their time, talent and treasure to update our current Extended Care room. Working together they were able to complete the project in a short time span. The room will be number 2019, in remembrance of their gift.

He remembers hearing the bell rung, from the extended hand of a Sister, outside the lower floor-landing window, signaling play time was over. Inside the building, he remembers the trash chutes, the actual black chalkboards, the beautiful wood floors and railings, and the secret doors that Sisters walked through, but as a student didn't know was behind. But, as he tells me, it was his teachers and his classmates that he remembers and treasures the most.

We thank Father Joe, for all that he has done for the OLPH Development Department, over the years. We wish him, and all the 9er graduates, many blessings in the years to come.


