I want to start off by sharing some exciting news. 2023 marks the 90th anniversary of Our Lady of Perpetual Help School! What an accomplishment! Since 1933, OLPH School has provided a quality Catholic education to MANY children of Daly City, and we are so pleased to be continuing our legacy today. This year our school theme is "Disciples in Christ". We were inspired by the impact that our school has had on this community and welcome the joy of working together-teachers, parents and students-to recognize the importance of serving as Disciples of Christ through our work and deeds.

This is also an important year for our school as we are in the final preparation stages for our WCEA/WASC Accreditation visit. This visit, which takes place every six years, seeks to validate the good work that the school is doing and then creates a framework for setting goals

to take us through the next six years. Our goals are wide-reaching and aim to support our work around faith formation, student programs, teacher professional development, and the creation of a Strategic Plan. We will prioritize the school's needs and then work to plan financially to make sure we can accomplish these goals. As always, we are grateful for the support of our Alumni community to help us as these special projects come up. We also ask for prayers and well wishes for a successful visit this March 1st through the 3rd.

One major project that is in the planning phase is an update of our restrooms on either side of Alumni Hall. Although the bathrooms have been painted and new stalls installed in both bathrooms the tile work, faucet, toilets and plumbing need to be addressed. This is no small project since most of the work remains the same since the building was erected in 1947, but we are confident we can get this done with your help. ## **Our Lady of Perpetual Help School** — A brief 90 year history

In 1933, Our Lady of Perpetual Help School (OLPH), located in Daly City, opened as a four-classroom building with two grades in each room serving students in 1st-6th Grades. The Sisters of St. Joseph of Orange served as administrators, teachers, and staff when the school opened. The present school building was built in 1947 under the direction of Pastor James Bergin, with each grade having its own classroom. In 1972, the school adopted the British Open Plan. In 1981, OLPH returned to self-contained, age-leveled classrooms. A full-time kindergarten was added in 1983. In 1984 a lay administrator was hired. In June 1987, the Sisters of Saint Joseph returned to Orange, California, leaving OLPH.

A Sister of Mercy, Sr. Philomene Golonka, who was hired as a teacher in 1987, remained on staff until her retirement in 2015. The school continues to follow the mission of both the Sisters of Mercy and the Sisters of St. Joseph of Orange: establishing school unity and spirit, acceptance of self and others, and social justice and reconciliation. A relationship with the Sisters of Mercy continues today. In 2018, OLPH joined the CSJ Educational Network (a ministry of the Sisters of St. Joseph of Orange) to build upon the mission of our founding Sisters.

An extended care program, before and after school, was added in 1997. The junior high classes (6th-8th Grades) began using a departmentalized program in September 2000 and Transitional Kindergarten was added in 2014. The technology program, which began with Macintosh computers, funded in large part by the Gellert Foundation, continues to improve each year and the 'library' has been converted into a media center. With a huge effort by Development Director, Edward Mahoney ('61) The school cafeteria was named Alumni Hall and now displays each graduating class. The Ferrari Family, in memory of Mary Louise Ferrari, donated beautiful display cases where trophies and awards are available for viewing.

The present staff is composed of ten classroom teachers, two of whom also serve as vice principals. Our staff is diverse, and the languages spoken include Spanish, English, and Tagalog. The school has the services of two instructional aides, a full-time computer teacher, a music teacher, a physical education teacher, and a Spanish teacher. Support staff includes an administrative assistant and extended care director, and bookkeeper. Five staff members have served OLPH for over 15 years.

Over 2,700 students have graduated from Our Lady of Perpetual Help School. The school remains dedicated to its mission: "At Our Lady of Perpetual Help School, we aspire to educate the whole child spiritually, intellectually, socially, psychologically, and physically, in light of Catholic/Christian principles and service. We are committed to providing our students with a quality education, which will prepare them for their roles in society".

For over 90 years the school continues to thrive, in large part, due to the dedicated principals who served the OLPH community and were responsible for the efforts listed above and so much more.

She is personally responsible for recruiting many of our current OLPH families from her own network. She also works to get the community involved in the service of our students. She has recruited local businesses to spread the word about OLPH and solicited companies for donations. In May 2020, our recipient suffered a medical emergency that scared us all. Her resilience and strength to overcome so much is something that all of us can bear witness to. I know she relies heavily on her faith, to help her get through the hard times. She is an example for us all at OLPH showing us what the power of faith, determination, and strength looks like.

#### **OLPH STUDENTS SERVE OTHERS**



An important part of Our Lady of Perpetual Help School mission is to teach our students to serve others. Every year, each class chooses an organization to help. Examples include, writing letters to seniors, entertaining residents at the Pomeroy Center, serving at the SF Food Bank, participating in a beach clean-up, or donating items to the Saint Vincent DePaul Society. Having recently gone through severe weather storms and flooding in the Bay Area, the Student Council leaders organized a clothing donation drive. The entire school came together and donated clothing to give to children and teens in shelters. The clothing was given to the Samaritan House in San Mateo. The volunteers were grateful for our help explaining that teens in shelters are often forgotten.

The graduating class of 2017 donated an awning that hung above the doors out to the yard. This awning prevented rain and wind from coming into the building. Unfortunately, it did not survive the recent storms. We are hoping to raise funds for its replacement.

## WE ARE BLESSED

In order to continue to meet the financial needs of a school it is essential that Administrators look beyond their current parent families, who are, in many cases, already struggling to pay tuition, to generate funds for the students for a safe building facility, the latest in technology and curriculum, as well as financial assistance, thus creating stability for the future.

One avenue that OLPH has pursued is the application to foundations that provide grants for those who qualify. The earliest and longest foundation that has been helping us meet our needs is the Carl and Celia Gellert Foundation. For over 35 years, we have maintained a close partnership with the Gellert Foundation, and they have provided us, each year, with assistance to upgrade our technology program and our tuition program, and to the upgrading of our curricular projects. In April 2022, we received notification that the Gellert Foundation would be discontinuing its distribution of funds to schools. However, Our Lady of Perpetual Help School had been selected to become the recipient of one of their final Sunset Grants. We were informed that the Trustees would arrive, in person, to hand us the grant check. Sharing this great news with staff members and students, we prepared a special thank you presentation for their arrival. On the day they arrived, they announced that not only would be receiving the amount they had told us, but an additional \$50,000 because they believed, "that OLPH is the exact school that Carl and Celia Gellert had in mind to help when they began their foundation." Imagine the joy and tears of the school community, when they made this announcement. The Trustees were so impressed by the heartfelt gratitude of students and staff they later gifted us additional money. We have been blessed by the Carl and Celia Foundation and will continue on in the spirit of their mission.

Other foundations that have helped us over the years include The O'Dell Fund, The Hugh and Hazel Darling Foundation, The Raskob Foundation, The Olympic Club Foundation, and The Wilsey Foundation.

Not only are we blessed by foundations who help us achieve our goals, we are also blessed by our alum and friends who help us achieve stability for our future.
